The season of Advent, a time of waiting and anticipation, is a sacred journey, and we're excited to embark on this spiritual voyage together. In this series, we'll be delving into the Gospel readings from the lectionary calendar cycle B, which will guide us from the initial anticipation of Christ's coming to the joyful celebration of His birth. Each week, we'll explore a different aspect of the Advent story and hear these timeless truths afresh.

December 3, 2023

Hope: Anticipation and Alertness Mark 13:24–-37 A sermon on the first Sunday of Advent about the importance of readiness for Christ's return.

December 10, 2023

Peace: Affirmation in the Wilderness Mark 1:1--8 A reflection on John the Baptist's dedication and his role in paving the path for Christ.

December 17, 2023 Joy: Acknowledging the Anointed One John 1:6--8, 19--28 A sermon on the third Sunday of Advent about John's testimony about Jesus and his selfless nature.

December 24, 2023

Love: Angelic Announcement Luke 1:26–-38 A reflection on the angel Gabriel's message to Mary and her courageous response.

Christmas Carol Service, December 24, 6:30 pm

A service of hymns about Christmas presented by the choir and readings from the gospels telling the Christmas story.

Christmas Eve Service, December 24, 11:00 pm

The Arrival of the Almighty Luke 2:1--20 A sermon on Christmas Eve about the nativity story and the joyous response of the shepherds.

This Advent, as we prepare our hearts and minds for Christmas, let us journey together. May we welcome the awe-inspiring, the wonderful, the Anointed One into our lives anew. May this series bless you, challenge you, and bring you closer to the heart of God as we anticipate and celebrate the arrival of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

From the Desk of Pastor Jonathan

Dear Fellow Believer,

As the echoes of Thanksgiving fade and the sanctuary starts to twinkle with the colors of Christmas, we transition into a season of anticipation and preparation—-Advent. However, in the Gospel of Mark, we encounter a unique perspective of this season. Instead of the birth of Baby Jesus, Mark's Gospel begins with the voice of John the Baptist, a voice crying out in the wilderness.

John the Baptist emerges as a symbol of Advent, embodying the necessity to prepare the way for the coming of Jesus. In Mark 1:4, he proclaims a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. This is a call for each of us to prepare our hearts for the coming of our Savior.

Advent, therefore, becomes a season of spiritual preparation. It should be a time for us to examine our hearts, to repent of our sins, and to clear our paths—removing any obstacles that might hinder us from fully receiving Christ.

The Gospel of Mark also reminds us of the enduring promise of Jesus: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away." (Mark 13:31). During this Advent season, we should meditate on His promises that never fail and anticipate with joy the fulfillment of His promise: the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

As the candles of the Advent wreath are lit each week, remember that each flame is a symbol of Christ's light breaking into our world, our lives, and our hearts. It is our responsibility to share this light with others, extending love, peace, hope, and joy to those around us.

This Advent, it is important to prepare our hearts anew to receive the Christ, our Savior, King, and Redeemer. The humble circumstances of His arrival remind us that He is Immanuel, "God with us," in every circumstance of our lives.

Throughout this blessed season of Advent, my prayer is for each of us to experience a fresh encounter with Christ, and that His love, peace, joy, and hope would fill our hearts to overflowing.

Please help us make this a success!


Board of Evangelism




