Matthew 25:14--30

On Stewardship Sunday, this parable calls us to be faithful stewards of the gifts God has given us, using them to serve others and advance the reign of God.

November 19, 2023

Readiness Over Complacency

Matthew 25:1--13

We learn about the importance of being spiritually prepared and vigilant, keeping our lamps filled with oil as we wait for the Bridegroom.

November 26, 2023

Compassion Over Indifference

Matthew 25:31--46

Here we are reminded about the centrality of compassion in our faith, and the importance of seeing Christ in the least of our brothers and sisters.

A Journey Together

"Faith in Action" is more than a study of these passages. It's an invitation to live out our faith in practical and transformative ways. It's an opportunity to reflect on how we can put our faith into action in our daily lives, serving others, using our talents wisely, and living in readiness for Christ's return.


Coming in November

Every Communion Sunday, before Communion is served, children will return to the sanctuary to witness &/or participate in the Lord's Supper as your family feels called. At St. Paul UCC we trust parents to decide when their child will participate in Communion. We believe that whatever you decide, God continues to be a presence in your child's life and walks with them their whole life long. As the Church, we have made covenant to teach our children the rituals of the faith and to provide meaning for why we do what we do.

We will continue supporting our "Thankful Pumpkin" tradition by giving each family a pumpkin. Sunday, November 5, we will handout pumpkins in our Sunday School classrooms and in the Fellowship Hall. 
